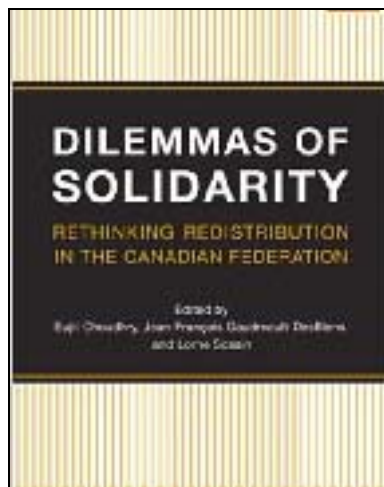

Professor Gaudreault-DesBiens has worked extensively on the law's apprehension of identity-related phenomena, both from an epistemological angle and from a constitutional law angle. His most recent work focuses on the legal theory of federalism, on the legal treatment of religious claims, and on the relations between the civil law and common law traditions in a globalised economy.
