Sir,

I am directed by His Excellency the Governor to request that in conjunction with the other Magistrates named in the Margin, or any two of them, in case of the unavoidable absence of the others, you will make particular enquiry and take Depositions respecting the circumstances of the death of a black Native who is reported to have been taken by the Mounted Police and shot, soon after the Murder of Mr. Brown's servant; this being understood to be a case distinct from that of the three natives respectively whose deaths the Magistrates have already reported.
