

Dalziel, Hunter River
27 July 1879

I am obliged by the prompt assistance sent me in the pursuit of this, and am happy to inform you that I have seen nothing of the Black Kangaroo. I went out on the morning with two of my men, and 2 constables, and found the tracks of the hocks of cows, to be high ground on the margin of the river in the recesses, and saw a good deal of tracks, and small tracks, both up and down the large creek which divides my land, but I did not feel justified in going to a greater distance after them. My son, who is peopled at a convenient spot, to the west of the creek, to whose name I mentioned, shall have my men forthcoming to identify them.
