Defendant appeared in person.

Explains that he has 1000 abra of barley at Tameslouht & 1000 abras of barley at Malay Brahim & 400 abras of wheat at Tameslouht. He admits that he delivered 1000 abras of barley to Mr. Lambert, thinking that he was entitled to do so. His delivery took place about 2 months ago early in October.

Court is satisfied that, despite defendant's plea that the amount of grain seized was smaller than the amount ahewn in the marshal's return, & that only the 1000 abras delivered to Mr. Lambert have been recovered from Tameslouht, grain seized by the Coiurt has been disposed of unlawfully.

Contempt of Court is proven & defendant is fined 5 Pounds with Court costs to be taxed & paid by noon on the 29th November 1934. Failure to pay this fine, with Court costs, within the prescribed time will be punishable by imprisonment.

To Mohamed el Meslohi, of Marrakesh.

You have this day been charged before this Court for that you did wilfully fail to comply with an order of execution attaching certain of your goods and chattels, the said order issuing from this Court on the 31st July, 1933, in an action wherein you, the said Mohamed el Meslohi, are defendant, and Joseph Bitton is plaintiff, committing thereby contempt of Court, contrary to section 135 (iv) of "The Morocco Orders in Council, 1889-1929, Consolidated."

Therefore, you are commanded in the name of His Majesty King GEORGE, to appear before this Court on Monday the 26 day of November 1934 at 11 a.m. to answer to the said charge and to be further dealt with according to law.
